GENERAL INFORMATION

The day of the funeral service or memorial service, it is customary for the family to arrive at the church or funeral chapel one hour prior to the service. This will allow the family time for a flower service and to gather together and to pay their last respects prior to the casket being closed at the beginning of the service. The funeral directors will assist the immediate family with parking.

The customary order in which the family enters the church is as follows: The surviving spouse, children (and their families), parents, brothers and sisters, and other relatives.

Enroute to the cemetery all vehicles should travel with their headlights on for safety. Once at the cemetery, it will take a few minutes to get all of the vehicles parked. For the comfort of the family, we recommend that the family stay in their vehicles until they see the pallbearers gather at the back of the funeral coach.
